DEPARTMENT OF BIBLE

- BI. 131 OLD TESTAMENT SURVEY** **3 Semester Hours**
A survey of the Old Testament books with special attention to the introduction, history, and main teaching of each book and main types of literature in the Old Testament.
- BI.132 NEW TESTAMENT SURVEY** **3 Semester Hours**
A survey of the New Testament books with special attention given to the political, social, economics and religious world of the first century.
- BI. 133 BIBLE DOCTRINE I** **3 Semester Hours**
A detailed study of Bibliology, Theology and Anthropology.
- BI. 134 BIBLE DOCTRINE II** **3 Semester Hours**
A detailed study of Soteriology, Ecclesiology, Angelology and Eschatology.
- BI.135 BIBLICAL APPLICATION** **3 Semester Hours**
A practical application on the Bible to everyday life.
- BI. 231 HOMILETICS I** **3 Semester Hours**
A study of the principles of sermon preparation.
- BI. 232 HOMILETICS II** **3 Semester Hours**
A study of sermon delivery.
- BI. 233 GENESIS** **3 Semester Hours**
A thorough study of the first book of the Bible. Special emphasis is given to creation, the flood and the early history of the world.
- BI. 234 EXODUS-DEUTERONOMY** **3 Semester Hours**
A study of the books of Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, and Deuteronomy.
- BI. 235 JOSHUA & JUDGES** **3 Semester Hours**
A study of the books of Joshua and Judges.
- BI. 236 I & II SAMUEL** **3 Semester Hours**
A study of the books of I Samuel and II Samuel.
- BI. 237 BIBLE ANALYSIS** **3 Semester Hours**
A study of the science and principles of Bible interpretation. The basic methods and rules for interpreting parables, types, figurative language and prophecy are presented with special emphasis on premillennial teaching.
- BI. 331 GOSPELS** **3 Semester Hours**
A thorough study of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John detailing the life of Jesus.
- BI. 332 ROMANS & CORINTHIANS** **3 Semester Hours**
A verse by verse study of Romans, I Corinthians and II Corinthians.

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DEPARTMENT OF BIBLE (continued)

- BI. 333 SHORTER EPISTLES** **3 Semester Hours**
Paul's shorter Epistles, the books from Galatians through Philemon are studied.
- BI. 334 KINGS-ESTHER** **3 Semester Hours**
A study of I & II Kings, I & II Chronicles, Ezra Nehemiah and Esther.
- BI. 335, 340 POETICAL BOOKS** **6 Semester Hours**
A survey of Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Song of Solomon and Ecclesiastes.
- BI. 336 ACTS** **3 Semester Hours**
A detailed study of the book of Acts and the church.
- BI. 337 BIBLE MANNERS AND CUSTOMS** **3 Semester Hours**
A study of houses, food, dress, daily activities, and occupations of Biblical people in relations to the scripture.
- BI. 338 BIBLICAL HISTORY** **3 Semester Hours**
A study of Biblical History in support of the Textus Receptus manuscript from which we derive the King James 1611.
- BI. 339 HOLY SPIRIT** **3 Semester Hours**
A study of the doctrine of Pneumatology and the ministry of the Holy Spirit in the life of the believer.
- BI. 431 MAJOR PROPHETS** **3 Semester Hours**
A practical and analogical study of the major prophet books.
- BI. 432 MINOR PROPHETS** **3 Semester Hours**
A thorough study of Minor Prophets.
- BI. 433 GENERAL EPISTLES** **3 Semester Hours**
An introductory guide of James, I & II Peter, I, II, & III John and Jude.
- BI. 434 HEBREWS** **3 Semester Hours**
A verse by verse study of Hebrews.
- BI. 435 DANIEL AND REVELATION** **3 Semester Hours**
A study of Daniel and Revelation which deals with things to come.

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DEPARTMENT OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

- CE. 131 CHRISTIAN MANHOOD** **3 Semester Hours**
A basic course giving special attention to problem areas in the lives of Christian men.
- CE. 132 CHRISTIAN WOMANHOOD** **3 Semester Hours**
A basic course giving special attention to problem areas in the lives of Christian women.
- CE. 133 PERSONAL EVANGELISM** **3 Semester Hours**
An emphasis on the man, methods, message and means of evangelism.
- CE. 231 LEADERSHIP** **3 Semester Hours**
A study of the motivation, principles, characteristics and attributes of leaders.
- CE. 232 PHILOSOPHY OF CHRISTIAN LIVING** **3 Semester Hours**
A study that places Christian living in its proper perspective.
- CE. 233 CHRISTIAN WORKER'S WIFE** **3 Semester Hours**
A detailed study of the role of the Christian worker's wife, her preparation opportunities, and problems.
- CE. 236 CHRISTIAN ETHICS** **3 Semester Hours**
A course designed to instruct Christians how to properly behave themselves as members of society.
- CE. 237 INTERPERSONAL RELATIONSHIPS** **3 Semester Hours**
A course designed to teach Christians how to interrelate among different types of people and avoid problems in human relationships.
- CE. 331,338 GENERAL BUSINESS FOR CHRISTIAN WORKERS** **6 Semester Hours**
This is a practical course which will train Christian workers to handle financial matters from a Christian perspective.
- CE. 334 RELIGIOUS CULTS** **3 Semester Hours**
A study of the historical and theological positions of modern day perversions of Biblical truth.
- CE. 333 BIOGRAPHY OF GREAT MEN** **3 Semester Hours**
An examination of the great men of the Christian faith and their ingredients to success.
- CE. 334 CHRISTIAN FAMILY** **3 Semester Hours**
A study of the principles and techniques useful in relationships between husband and wife, parents and children.
- CE. 335 CHRISTIAN PHILOSOPHY** **3 Semester Hours**
A study of philosophy from a Christian viewpoint.

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DEPARTMENT OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION (continued)

- CE. 336 LIVING BY FAITH** **3 Semester Hours**
A study of the Victorious Christian Life and the role of Biblical Faith in the life of the Christian.
- CE. 337 PRINCIPLES OF BIBLICAL TEACHING** **3 Semester Hours**
This course teaches the needs of teaching the Bible according to the Bible.
- CE. 339 SUCCESSFUL PARENTING** **3 Semester Hours**
This course is a Biblical study of the family and its preservation as the basic unit of society from one generation to the next.
- CE. 361 ANGELOLOGY** **3 Semester Hours**
A study of the doctrine of Angels.
- CE. 431 APPLIED EVANGELISM** **3 Semester Hours**
A practical application of the techniques from personal evangelism.

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DEPARTMENT OF CHURCH ADMINISTRATION

ADM. 231, 232 MINISTERIAL PRACTICALTIES **6 Semester Hours**

A course designed to *cover* all of the practical aspects of the work of the pastor.

ADM. 331, 332 CHURCH EDUCATION **6 Semester Hours**

A study of the organization and administration of a local church. The duties of the church workers as emphasized.

ADM. 333 SUNDAY SCHOOL ADMINISTRATION **3 Semester Hours**

A study of organizing and planning the operation of a Sunday School.

ADM. 431 CHURCH & SCHOOL FINANCIAL ADMIN. **3 Semester Hours**

A study of the financial organization and administration of a local church and school, including how to avoid a financial crisis.

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DEPARTMENT OF COMPUTERS

CMP. 134 COMPUTERS FOR CHRISTIAN WORKERS I 3 Semester Hours

A course designed to equip the student with an introductory knowledge of computers.

CMP. 135 COMPUTERS FOR CHRISTIAN WORKERS II 3 Semester Hours

A course designed to equip the student with an introductory knowledge of computers.

CMP. 231 INTRO. TO COMPUTER PROGRAMMING 3 Semester Hours

The basic principles of computer programming.

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DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION

- EDU. 231 HISTORY & PHILOSOPHY OF EDUCATION** **3 Semester Hours**
A study of the philosophical, historical, and social foundation of American Education
- EDU. 232 INTRO. TO CHRISTIAN EDUCATION** **3 Semester Hours**
Introduces the total field of Christian education with emphasis upon its importance, history, philosophy, aims and objectives.
- EDU. 331 PRINCIPLES OF TEACHING** **3 Semester Hours**
This course surveys the development of education with emphasis on the principles of teaching.
- EDU. 332, 332 GENERAL TEACHING METHODS I, II** **6 Semester Hours**
A course designed to introduce methods of instruction for the general elementary class with emphasis on student involvement.
- EDU. 333 TEACHING PRACTICALITIES** **3 Semester Hours**
A course designed to introduce methods of instruction for the secondary class with emphasis on student involvement.
- EDU. 334 TEACHING MUSIC IN THE CHRISTIAN SCHOOL** **3 Semester Hours**
A course designed to introduce music instruction with emphasis on student involvement.
- EDU. 335 ASPECTS OF TEACHING** **3 Semester Hours**
A course designed to provide a thorough overview of effective, successful teaching.
- EDU. 336 CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT** **3 Semester Hours**
Theory and practices of curriculum design and evaluation.
- EDU. 337 PRACTICAL TEACHING** **3 Semester Hours**
Practical hands-on experience in the classroom as a teacher's aide.
- EDU. 431 SENIOR SEMINAR** **3 Semester Hours**
To aid students in relating Christian educational concepts to the problem and challenges in contemporary education.
- EDU. 432 STUDENT TEACHING** **9 Semester Hours**
Under the supervision of an experienced teacher, the student teacher will make lesson plans, prepare instructional materials and teach classes. Five days per week for one semester will spent in this program.

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DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

ENG. 131, 132 ENGLISH COMPOSITION

6 Semester Hours

Reviews the principles of grammar and usage in oral and written English, directs, reading and analysis of selected examples of prose, and requires frequent compositions, with attention to logical relation and arrangements of ideas. Procedures are introduced for the effective use of the library and for the preparation of a research paper.

ENG. 231 ENGLISH LITERATURE

3 Semester Hours

A survey presented historically and critically through lectures, outside reading, research papers and discussions. Extends from Beowulf to modern times in English Literature.

ENG. 232 AMERICAN LITERATURE

3 Semester Hours

This course extends from William Bradford to modern times in American literature.

ENG. 233 SPEECH

3 Semester Hours

The basic principles of public speaking with an emphasis on speech organization and studying different types of speech.

ENG. 331 ADVANCED GRAMMAR AND COMPOSITION

3 Semester Hours

A course with continued practice in writing and revision of papers with special emphasis on grammar and clarity of thought.

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DEPARTMENT OF FOREIGN LANGUAGES

FL. 331 GREEK I

3 Semester Hours

This course is basic grammar and syntax (including basic vocabulary, principal parts and pronunciation) designed to bring the student to the place of translating portions of the New Testament.

FL. 332 Greek II

3 Semester Hours

A continuation of Greek 331.

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DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY

- HIS. 131 AMERICAN HISTORY I** **3 Semester Hours**
A study of the social and political life of the Americas in light of scriptures to 1865.
- HIS. 132 AMERICAN HISTORY II** **3 Semester Hours**
A continuation of History 131 from 1865 to present.
- HIS. 231, 232 WORLD HISTORY** **6 Semester Hours**
Christian perspective of the history of mankind.
- HIS. 331, 332 AMERICANISM** **6 Semester Hours**
A study of our great American heritage and stressing the necessity of its preservation.
- HIS. 333 AMERICAN GOVERNMENT** **3 Semester Hours**
A philosophical study of American Government.
- HIS. 431 CHURCH HISTORY** **3 Semesters Hours**
Study of the formation of the New Testament Church and its course through history.
- HIS. 432 HISTORY SEMINAR** **3 Semester Hours**
A through approach to historical research, governmental organization and economics.

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DEPARTMENT OF MATH

MTH. 231 INTERMEDIATE MATH

3 Semester Hours

Sets: historical background and numerating systems, material numbers, binary operations of signed numbers, rational numbers, fractions, exponents, equations of one and two variables, and linear graphs.

MTH. 232 ALGEBRA

3 Semester Hours

Real numbers, complex numbers, fractions, binary operations of polynomials, quadratic equations, relations and functions, basic study of trigonometric functions and applications.

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DEPARTMENT OF MUSIC

- MU. 101** **2 Semester Hours**
- MU. 102** **2 Semester Hours**
- MU. 111, 112, 211, 212, 311, 312, 411, 412 APPLIED MUSIC** **8 Semesters Hours**
Individual instruction is offered in voice, piano, and organ. Credit is based on one semester hour's credit for each one-half hour lesson in the studio. At the end of each semester, jury examinations will be held in applied music. The music major must be registered for applied music in his area of concentration each semester of residence.
- MU. 113, 114, 213, 214 313, 314, 413, 414 CHORUS/ENSEMBLE** **8 Semester Hours**
Music majors must participate in at least one ensemble activity each semester in residence. Ensembles presently include sanctuary choir, College singers and various groups organized for a given semester.
- MU. 211, 212, 311, 312 SECONDARY MUSIC** **4 Semester Hours**
All music majors must register for individual instruction in a musical activity outside their areas of concentration, i.e., voice major must register for instrumental and/or keyboard.
- MU. 231, 232 MUSIC THEORY** **6 Semester Hours**
A fundamental study of rhythm, melody and harmony through ear training, sightsinging, keyboard and written drills. Basic studies in musical style and practice in the important historical periods are also included.
- MU. 234 CHURCH MUSIC FOR THE CHRISTIAN WORKER** **3 Semester Hours**
A fundamental study of the church music.
- MU. 331, 332 HISTORY OF MUSIC** **6 Semester Hours**
The evolution and development of music from antiquity to the present.
- MU. 333, 334 PHILOSOPHY OF SACRED MUSIC** **6 Semester Hours**
A through study of sacred music from a Biblical viewpoint.
- MU. 431 CHURCH MUSIC ADMINISTRATION** **3 Semester Hours**
This course is designed to give an introduction to the use and administration of the church music program.
- MU. 432 SENIOR RECITAL** **3 Semester Hours**
Recital required as outlined by the Applied Music (MU. 111-412) instructor.
- MU. 433, 434 SENIOR SEMINAR** **6 Semester Hours**
The music major must register for two senior seminars or one Senior seminar and a senior recital at the discretion of the faculty advisor. Seminars will vary in subject matter from semester to semester. They will cover advanced study in such areas such as Music Theory,

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History. Literature. Twentieth-Century Idioms. Composition, etc., conducted through guided research, discussion, and critical analysis of musical works.

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DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY

- PSY. 131 CHRISTIAN PSYCHOLOGY** **3 Semester Hours**
An introductory course designed to acquaint students with the field of psychology with a Christian perspective.
- PSY. 132 DEVELOPMENTAL PSYCHOLOGY** **3 Semester Hours**
The study of mankind and psychological characteristics in line with Scriptural positions.
- PSY. 331 EDUCATIONAL PSYCHOLOGY** **3 Semester Hours**
An application of psychological principles to the problems of instruction.
- PSY. 431,432 CHRISTIAN COUNSELING** **6 Semester Hours**
This course is designed to prepare the Christian worker to effectively counsel individuals in regards to self image, interpersonal relations, moral freedom, conscience and other personal problems requiring answer to personal and spiritual needs.
- PSY. 433 PASTORAL COUNSELING** **3 Semester Hours**
A course designed according to the book of Proverbs on how to effectively deal with problems of church members.

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DEPARTMENT OF SCIENCE

SCI. 131, 132 GENERAL BIOLOGY

6 Semester Hours

This course is devoted to a systematic study of both plant and animal kingdoms. The theme is developed from the physiological approach with an emphasis on God's special work in creation. Three lecture hours and one laboratory hour per week.

SCI. 231, 232 BIBLICAL SCIENCE

6 Semester Hours

A study of science as related to the Bible emphasizing a literal six day creation and the fundamental facts and principles of physics and chemistry.
